#### **CREMATION NUMBERS AND OTHER UPDATES**

# 1. Purpose of report

To provide the Joint Committee with the latest update on cremation numbers and other aspects of Bramcote Crematorium.

#### 2. Background and Detail

At its meeting of 20 June 2019 Joint Committee noted and requested the following:

"Concern was raised that the number of cremations was lower than anticipated which created a budget shortfall. RESOLVED that a detailed report on cremation numbers ... be brought to the Joint Committee."







#### Estimating numbers for the remainder of the year

It is, of course, difficult to predict cremation numbers for the rest of the year. On the one hand the resurgence in Covid-19 could lead to a significant increase again; on the other hand, the first wave had a particular focus on those with underlying health conditions – in some cases, sadly, these people may well have passed away during 2020/21 regardless of Covid-19. Regular updates will be brought to committee.

#### Christmas service of remembrance 2020

This year's Christmas service of remembrance is being designed an online event due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. This is because current government rules and social distancing requirements would restrict capacity to little more than 15% of the numbers who usually attend.

A verbal update on the latest plans will be given at Committee. These are, of course, subject to change.

# **Building fabric update**

- Covid-19 screening has been installed in the Serenity Chapel for the chapel attendant, and in the main reception area for the receptionist. There was already a separate room adjacent to the Reflection Chapel for the chapel attendant.
- Current capacity for mourners is 30 in the larger Serenity Chapel and 17 in the smaller Reflection Chapel. At the time of writing funeral numbers are restricted by law to a maximum of 30 people.
- The main building experienced flooding in June 2020 at a time of exceptional (but perhaps now more frequent?) rainfall. The immediate response has been to increase drainage inspections and rodding etc, but it may well be prudent to bring forward the £60,000 currently allocated for Drainage and Parking improvements at the Crematorium from 2022/23 to 2021/22.
- The £40,000 allocated for roof repairs in 2020/21 will be spent before the financial year end.

#### Bereavement software

Unfortunately, the tendering exercise has proved challenging. The leading tender may be unacceptable on technical grounds, and the second best tender came in considerably in excess of the available budget of £15,720.

A further verbal update will be provided at Committee. Depending on the matters debated this may need to be debated in closed session.

#### Financial Information

The income budget for 2020/21 is based upon 2,450 adult cremations and 50 direct cremations. Whilst a distribution of £300,000 each to Broxtowe and Erewash Borough Councils for 2020/21 was agreed by the Joint Committee on 16 January 2020 and will be paid accordingly, a failure to meet income targets could adversely affect the distribution in future years.

The medium term financial strategy (MTFS) to 2022/23 also considered by the Joint Committee on 16 January 2020 indicated a potential increase to £400,000 per annum in the distribution to the two authorities from 2021/22 onwards if the assumptions in the 2020/21 budget proved to be reasonably accurate.

#### 2. Background and Detail

Committee will recall discussing other possible services for Bramcote Crematorium at its meeting of 25 June 2020. Reference was made to the diverse range of services provided at Sandwell Crematorium and Committee requested further information.

Sandwell Crematorium is owned and operated by Sandwell Metropolitan Borough Council and is a very diverse crematorium. Facilities provided include: -

- low cost funerals
- wake facilities (on site and crematorium-operated)
- a café (on site but privately-operated)
- pet cremation (off site) and memorials (on site)

**APPENDIX** 

#### The Sandwell Funeral Service - a low cost funeral

This is a low cost funeral service with a dignified cremation at one of Sandwell's two crematoria costing £1,643. The service was first introduced in October 2016.

#### This includes:

- a coffin
- a funeral service with a minister
- all crematorium and doctor's fees
- music of your choice.

The loved one is taken into the care of Sandwell's partner Trinity Funeral Services Limited (a private funeral director) and the funeral service can be held at either crematorium. It is aimed at families and individuals who prefer a simple ceremony without the use of a hearse.

#### Wake facilities

The Sandwell Crematorium wake facility opened on site in 2015 at a cost of £340,000 and employs two staff. It seats 80 persons and has a dedicated kitchen and toilets. It also required the provision of an additional 22 on site car parking spaces.
