Focus of hearing:

The Panel may first need to consider whether the public should be excluded during part or all of the hearing of this matter under Regulation 14 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

14. Hearing to be public

- (1) Subject to paragraph (2), the hearing shall take place in public.
- (2) The licensing authority may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in so doing outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in public.
- (3) For the purposes of paragraph (2), a party and any person assisting or representing a party may be treated as a member of the public.

Representations have been received relating to the licensing objectives as follows:

- Prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- Prevention of public nuisance
- Protection of children from harm

Those making representations may wish to consider any conditions that they would like the Licensing Committee to consider attaching to the licence if they are minded to grant it.

The issues coming before the panel should be addressed as follows:

Relevance of representations.

Parking and traffic issues relate to planning matters and are not relevant representations. The question of need is not a relevant representation.

Protection of children from harm relates to the moral, psychological and physical safety of children within the premises.

Consideration of the application

Whether upon consideration of the facts, that the grant of an application by Mr Markandu Thayalaseelan in the terms applied for will undermine the above mentioned licensing objectives.

In considering this application, the Alcohol and Entertainment Sub-Committee will have regard to:

The representations from the Interested Party (Attached)

Conditions volunteered by the applicant and/or agreed in principle with responsible authorities.

The Licensing Act 2003, and in particular:

S4 General duties of licensing authorities

- (1). A licensing authority must carry out its functions under this Act ("licensing functions") with a view to promoting the licensing objectives.
- (2). The licensing objectives are—
 - (a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - (b) public safety;
 - (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - (d) the protection of children from harm.
- (3). In carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must also have regard to—
 - (a) its licensing statement published under section 5, and
 - (b) any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182.

S35 Determination of application under section 34

(1) This section applies where the relevant licensing authority—

- (a)receives an application, made in accordance with section 34, to vary a premises licence, and
- (b)is satisfied that the applicant has complied with any requirement imposed on him by virtue of subsection (5) of that section.
- (2) Subject to subsection (3) and section 36(6), the authority must grant the application.
- (3) Where relevant representations are made, the authority must—
 - (a)hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
 - (b)having regard to the representations, take such of the steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- (4) The steps are—
 - (a)to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b)to reject the whole or part of the application;
 - and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.
- (5) In this section "relevant representations" means representations which—
 - (a) are about the likely effect of the grant of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 - (b)meet the requirements of subsection (6).
- (6) The requirements are—
 - (a)that the representations are made by an interested party or responsible authority within the period prescribed under section 17(5)(c) by virtue of section 34(5).
 - (b)that they have not been withdrawn, and
 - (c)in the case of representations made by an interested party (who is not also a responsible authority), that they are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.
- (7) Subsections (2) and (3) are subject to sections 19 to 21 (which require certain conditions to be included in premises licences).

- 4. Chair considers requests for witnesses to be called by each of the parties (If any).
- 5. Chair assesses and then agrees the maximum period of time in minutes to be permitted for each party to address the relevant representations.
- 6. Chair invites the Applicant to outline his application and address the relevant representations and call any witnesses as agreed
- 7. After The applicant has spoken the Chair will invite each interested party to ask questions through the Chair
 - Interested parties
 - Licensing Committee members
- 8. After each speaker the Chair will invite the Applicant or his representative to respond through the Chair
- 9. The Chair invites the Interested parties to address the relevant representations and call any witnesses (if any) as agreed
- 10. After each speaker the Chair will invite the Applicant to respond through the Chair
- 11. The Chair asks the parties in the following order whether they have anything further to add as a closing statement.
 - Interested Parties;
 - Applicant.
- 12. Having clarified that all parties have had a fair hearing, the meeting will be closed and the panel will meet forthwith to determine the matter
- 13. The decision together with notification of the right to appeal will be given in writing to all parties within 5 working days of the meeting.
- **NB** The Chair may vary the procedure as necessary to ensure that a "directed discussion" takes place.

We will have ensure that challenge 25 will be on top of our priority so all four of our licensing objective are meet. Both owners of the business (husband and wife) have worked in retail for over 20 years and have the skills to implement and maintain the licensing objective in the higher standards. We also hold the alcohol personal license for over 10 years.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Build a good working relationship with the local PCSO and the police. We will not be serving any alcohol to any customer who are acting under the influence of alcohol. Number of customers in the shop at one time will not exceed 10 people at one time. We will have working CCTV in place with recordings kept over 30 days and made available to the Police and local council on there request.

c) Public safety

We will have fire exit marked on the doors, as well as no smoking signs on the doors and around the premises. All staff will be trained on how to evacuate the customers from the premises in case of fire. Their will be wet floor signs so customers are aware and we don't put them in risk.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The bin will be provided outside the premises for the customers to dispose their litter. We will also be having signs to advise customers to be mindful and keep the noise down when they leave they premises.

e) The protection of children from harm

We will have clear signs on the shop floor, alcohol section and by the till to let customers know we follow strict challenge 25 policy. Staff will be trained and regular refreshed on the challenge 25 policy. Refusal log will be kept on the EPOS tills and refusal book will be kept and made available to police and council on request. Staff will only accept, photo driving license, passport and accredited pass marked proof of age cards as an acceptable form of id.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in
 combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their
 name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
 with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
 subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
 when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
 number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.



- 1. A CCTV system with recording equipment shall be installed and recorded on the plan appended to the licence. The system shall be installed prior to the premises carrying out licensable activities and maintained in accordance with the system.
 - All recordings used in conjunction with CCTV shall:
 - be of evidential quality
 - Cover the point of sale, and entrance and exit
 - · indicate the time and date
 - be retained for a period of 31 days

I feel that the representations listed are relevant to all of the four points listed in the form.

With this is mind the changes that are proposed leave the residents of this private estate in danger of a number of issues I will go into below.

Jeffries was a local, family friendly shop only normally used by residents of this estate. It has had the same owner who is known and loved local by all shop users. However, over time and our home facing the shop seeing first hand that antisocial behaviour, drug use and people in cars loitering around who are not from this area is creeping in and it frightens residents. Robberies of the shop has risen over the last few years and whilst it is in small numbers, I can only see it getting worse if this goes ahead and eventually branching out into home break ins and problems for local residents. For example, just this week the shop was robbed of its charity book box with all the books inside by youths who were shouting and swearing creating a fearful environment, this will not improve. There is a huge lack of police presence of the estate.

I feel that the changes will increase this more with the introduction of a 'mini mart' style shop, selling alcohol and staying open late, there is a carpark for other businesses too that already some cars and people will congregate in late at night and cause stress and fear for the local residents especially the elderly, we feel as a community that this would get worse. Car parking nowhere near adequate enough to deal with the extension of this shop and the increase in trade that this will bring, our driveway is regularly blocked in by cars visiting the shop and other businesses in the same row making it impossible for us to leave our own home by car without searching for the owners of said cars. This is not acceptable and will only get worse if these proposed plans go ahead.

From that I would expect to see people coming on the estate creating noise pollution, leaving rubbish in the area, car noise and lights being left on cars into people's homes at night, noise from the music of cars and crime to go up, smells and pollution left behind and discarded alcohol before, during and after the hours of operation. This would be attracting unwanted trouble to our quiet family estate.

This leads me onto public safety, I fear for myself and other residents because of the reasons above especially those who enjoy living in a friendly warm community will not stand for any such behaviour thus becoming a target for these people and making our normal quiet home lives a thing of the past.

There is a school on the estate, and a lot of young families who's children play in the street of which my own child does and feels safe doing so. I fear that this would create an unsafe environment for young children to play. Also selling alcohol would tempt teenagers to try to buy alcohol from the shop illegally and congregate outside of the premises. I would also propose that the look of the shop being changed into a Premier, along with the selling of alcohol and later opening hours, the issues that will come with the shop will also decrease our property value or make it increasingly difficult to sell our homes that are on the vicinity of the shop on Horsendale Avenue. I for one would not choose to purchase a property in the close proximity of a shop with the aesthetics that are proposed along with the oncoming issues that will be brought on by the selling of alcohol and the later opening times.

I am objecting to the proposed use of 21 Horsedale Avenue. The property and the other businesses on the row have limited parking facilities.

There has been no allocation of parking spaces for specific busineses nor should there be. The businesses on the row have amicably shared the parking spaces as we all have transient customers and as well as employees who use the parking during the day. There are also flats that rely on the parking spaces above No 23 during the evening.

The on road parking on Horsendale Avenue is a problem when the on site parking is full. There have been numerous times vehicles have not been able to negotiate parked cars on the road and causes major problems for children/families going and coming from the school (Horsendale Primary).

My other concern is anti-social behaviour associated with Alcohol and premises that provide the access to it. The potential for litter and noise pollution from increased traffic through the evening and night (Up to 10.00pm) is increased. There would also have to be some level of assurances regarding the security of the surrounding businesses and residential premises with the inflows of none resident clientele using the access to the shop for alcohol and other goods.

There are other local shops that provide access to alcohol and groceries as in the BP garage, the Mornington ex Spar shop and the local supermarkets, Aldi and Tesco/ Iceland (Nuthall Road). These are not directly amongst residential premises and have specific parking for their customers. Another shop in a 'back street' position offering the same is not really required.

I live locally on Highfield Road and do not feel we need a small supermarket type shop in the area extra to what is already available.

I fully support the above application for an alcohol license. I live within sight and hearing of the row of shops on Horsendale Avenue and cannot envisage any significant problems with the granting of an alcohol license.

Until 1993 there was a greengrocers with an alcohol license at neighbouring number 25 that was open into the early evening - without any significant impact on the street or residents that I can recollect.

The current shop, even if expanded, is only a small retail premises and would be unable to carry a large range of stock, it is therefore unlikely to attract any custom other than local residents seeking a last minute emergency purchase. Most residents will have pre purchased at the supermarket while doing their weekly shop, similarly it is unlikely to attract off estate traffic to the shop as most people will be seeking the larger range and cheaper pricing available elsewhere.

I cannot see why any potential significant or regular anti-social behaviour or disorder would result from the premises having a license, due to the type of area that the Horsendale Estate is. It is unlikely to attract people from off of the estate due to it's location and other premises being more accessible on the A610.

I cannot foresee any reason why there would be any significant increase in noise, smells, litter or light pollution beyond that that is always created by a small retail premises or row of shops.

The benefit of having a premises with the evening opening that the alcohol license application envisages, is that other goods and services provided by the shop become available beyond the current closing time.

I wish to put on record my **support** for the above licensing application. The basis for this opposition is that granting a license for the premises will not be detrimental to the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance.

On the licensing objective of preventing crime and disorder

I anticipate that many will have made representation to the licensing committee in respect of a perceived fear of anti-social behaviour from teenagers purchasing and consuming alcohol in the vicinity of store. According to publicly available data (on police.uk) police reported antisocial behaviour occurrences in the period Jan-July 2020, located in the vicinity of a comparable licensed premise approximately 1 mile away (specifically Singh Convenience Store, Upminster Drive – formally Spar) were zero. Whilst fully appreciating the expertise of the licensing authority in matters concerning the correlation of crime statistics and licensed premises, I would suggest that this discredits the assertion that a licensed premise in this area would create antisocial behaviour

Further, there were only 4 instances of antisocial behaviour on the wider Horsendale Estate in the last 3 months of available figures (May, June and July 2020), compared to 92 instances of antisocial behaviour in the wider Eastwood South police district. It is my suggestion that representation against this proposal may have been made on an unfounded fear that the area within which the licensed premise is located is 'crime ridden' and that the licensed premises would be an escalator of antisocial behaviour. I would again suggest this to be untrue.

In consideration of general unreported nuisance behaviour I would ask the licensing authority to again make comparison to the similar licensed premises (Singh Convenience Store) where I am not aware of teenagers purchasing nor consuming alcohol.

On the licensing objective of prevention of public nuisance

I anticipate that many will have made representation to the licensing committee in respect of noise and congestion associated with increased deliveries and customers. I would suggest to the licensing authority that an alcohol license does not necessarily mean additional deliveries. The sales of alcohol are likely to be at a sufficiently low volume such that stock could be replenished within existing deliveries. The assertion that customers in vehicles will come into the area, intent on purchasing alcohol is likely to be unfounded considering that they would have to drive past many alternative licensed premises. The store is in a residential area with no through routes nor passing traffic the vast majority of its customers who intend to purchase alcohol will likely walk to the store and purchase alcohol in addition to other items.

General Points

The Nuthall Neighbourhood Plan 2015-2030 (p37) states that "Retailing is very limited in the Nuthall Parish itself". I wish to make you aware that the licensing application is part of a much wider endeavor by new owners to increase the size of the retail space and the range of products sold, along with greater opening hours. This will provide a much-needed amenity to local residents. There are 3 licensed premises within the proximity, the main ones being around 1 mile away necessitating a car journey or 30-40min walk. Having a licensed premise close to the residents of the estate will further support the aim of "reducing the need to travel particularly by private car" Nuthall Neighbourhood Plan 2015-2030 (p20) and the objective of "where possible enhance the balanced, inclusive community structure in Nuthall in the provision of local jobs and other facilities" (p19).


