## **What is the Forward Plan of Key and Exempt Decisions?**

Each month, the Council publishes a forward plan of key decisions, and potential exempt decisions, to be taken by the Council's Cabinet not earlier than 28 days after the publication of this notice.

## **What is a Key Decision?**

A Key Decision is defined under Regulation 8 of the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012 and is a decision made or to be made in connection with the discharge of an Executive function which is likely to:-

1. result in in the Council incurring revenue or capital expenditure or savings of £250,000 or more; or
2. be significant in terms of its effects on communities living or working in an area comprising two or more Wards or electoral divisions in the Council's area.

On the first day of each month a new forward plan of key decisions will be produced which will contain details of key and potential exempt decisions which, at the publication date, are expected to be considered.
