Report of the Portfolio Holder for Housing

Housing Strategy 2025 - 2028

1. Purpose of Report

To seek approval for a new Housing Strategy. This is in accordance with the Council's Corporate Priority of Housing - 'a good quality home for everyone'.

2. <u>Recommendation</u>

Cabinet is asked to RESOLVE to APPROVE the new Housing Strategy

3. Detail

A Housing Strategy is a local authority's vision for housing in its area. It sets out objectives on how the Council will manage and deliver its strategic housing role. It provides a framework against which the authority and relevant partners can deliver their services and create policies on specific housing issues.

Over Summer 2024 consultation was undertaken in inform the key themes and actions within the Housing Strategy. In person consultation meetings were held and an online survey was used. The views of 62 residents were obtained.

Employees from many teams were also consulted, including Housing, Planning, Asset Management and Private Sector Housing.

Following Policy Overview Working Group considering a draft of the strategy in November 2024, further work was completed and Policy Overview Working Group considered an updated version of the strategy in January 2025. The strategy and an Equality Impact Assessment is included in the **Appendix**.

4. Key Decision

This report is a key decision as defined under Regulation 8 of the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012, as it is significant in terms of its effects on communities living or working in an area comprising of two or more Wards or electoral divisions in the Council's area
