

Report of the Portfolio Holder for Resources and Personnel Policy

Citizens Advice Central Nottinghamshire – Grant Aid1. Purpose of Report

To provide Cabinet with an update on activity at the Broxtowe Division of Citizens Advice Central Nottinghamshire and approve the release of the second year of grant aid funding as approved by Cabinet in July 2024.

2. Recommendation

Cabinet is asked to NOTE the report from Citizens Advice Central Nottinghamshire and RESOLVE to release the second year grant aid funding of £73,750 for 2025/26 accordingly.

3. Detail

In July 2024, Cabinet approved grant aid of £73,750 to the Broxtowe Division of Citizens Advice Central Nottinghamshire (“CACN Broxtowe”), which included £10,000 towards the annual rental of accommodation in the Council Offices. The resolution included a commitment to award grant aid at this level in both 2025/26 and 2026/27, subject to a suitable Service Level Agreement and monitoring being in place. This three-year funding settlement was seen to provide some much-needed stability for CACN Broxtowe and give it a platform to lever in additional funds from other sources.

Under the terms of the funding settlement and the Service Level Agreement, CACN Broxtowe has submitted its update report for 2024/25. This is presented in **Appendix 1** for consideration.

The overall budget for grants to voluntary organisations in 2025/26 is £168,800. An amount of £73,750 has been earmarked from the overall grant aid budget towards CACN Broxtowe.

The overall budget for grants to voluntary organisations in 2025/26 includes an amount of £73,750 which has been earmarked for CACN Broxtowe. This includes £10,000 towards the rental obligation for the office accommodation at the Council Offices in Beeston.

7. Legal Implications

The Council is empowered to make grants to voluntary organisations by virtue of Section 48 Local Government Act 1985 (as well as other legislation). Having an approved process in line the legislation and the Council's Grant Aid Policy will ensure the Council's compliance with its legal duties.
