DEDICATED ACCOMMODATION FOR VETERANS	Broxtowe Borough Council intends to build 4 – 6 single-persons flats to be made available to veterans of any age. This new build will be in Stapleford and will commence in 2020 and be completed by 2021.
WELFARE FUNERALS FOR EX-SERVICE VETERANS	As a mark of respect and gratitude for ex-service men with no known family the borough council will bear the cost of an officient at welfare funerals for exservice veterans from Broxtowe or Erewash
